I. The Origin of the Law – Exodus 19-20

It was given to the Israelites orally by God while they were camped at Mount Sinai. God promised that they will be a peculiar treasure, a kingdom of priests, and an holy nation based upon their obedience to the covenant (cf. Exodus 19:4-5; 1 Peter 2:9-10). The people unanimously agreed to do all that they were commanded to do.

The Israelites came to Mount Sinai, camped there for three days, and the Lord was preparing to establish a covenant with His people by means of what we call the “Ten Commandments.”

In the morning, on the third day, a trumpet sounded, along with thunders, lightning, and a thick cloud which covered Mount Sinai.

II. The Order of the Law

God begins the Law by stating who He is and what He has done (The strongest argument for obedience is the experience of past deliverance).

A. The Lord is the Supreme Center followed by ones relationship to the family, then relationship to society

1. Commandment 1, 2, 3 & 4: Relationship to God

2. Commandment 5: Relationship to Family

3. Commandment 6, 7, 8, 9 & 10: Relationship to Others

B. Of the Ten, Nine commandments are given in the New Testament either word for word, or with more application for the Christian today

A. The Law is holy, spiritual, and good – Romans 7:12

B. The sinner is unable to keep the Law – Romans 8:3
