I. Jesus - The Captain of Their Salvation

Hebrews 2: 9-10 *But we see Jesus, who was made a little lower than the angels for the suffering of death (That is why He came; He came to die.), crowned with glory and honour; that he by the grace of God should taste death for every man. Jesus did not die for a few... He died for all. All have sinned. 10 For it became him, for whom are all things, and by whom are all things, in bringing many sons unto glory, to make the captain of their salvation perfect through sufferings.*

Joshua 5:12-15 (Let's get the context.) Verse 12. *And the manna ceased on the morrow after they had eaten of the old corn of the land; neither had the children of Israel manna any more; but they did eat of the fruit of the land of Canaan that year.* The Israelites have crossed Jordan... they are on the Promised Land side of the Jordan River and they are already for their first battle at Jericho as they try to accomplish the conquest of the Land of Promise.

Verse: 13 *And it came to pass, when Joshua was by Jericho, that he lifted up his eyes and looked, and, behold, there stood a man over against him with his sword drawn in his hand: and Joshua went unto him, and said unto him, Art thou for us, or for our adversaries?* Joshua saw things the way Christians are supposed to see things. You are on one side or the other. There is God's side and there is the world's side. Light, darkness, right, wrong, good, evil, just unjust. The world is constantly trying to mix them or neutralize everything – not so in the Bible. Verse: 14 *And he said, Nay; but as captain of the host of the LORD am I now come. And Joshua fell on his face to the earth, and did worship, and said unto him, What saith my lord unto his servant? 15 And the captain of the LORD's host said unto Joshua, Loose thy shoe from off thy foot; for the place whereon thou standest is holy. And Joshua did so.*

Jesus Christ was not manifest in a physical body of human flesh until He was born at Bethlehem. Yet many times throughout the Old Testament He appeared in various forms dealing with mankind:

- In the garden, the voice of the LORD walked in the garden in the cool of the day... slew the animals made coats of skins covering the man and his wife... had communication with them.
- He came down at the tower of Babel to review the building project.

- In Genesis 7:1 He stood in the door of the ark calling Noah and his family to come inside.

How do you know when the passage is speaking of Jesus? Because no angel would let a man worship him. In this case Joshua falls on his face to worship. Do you remember when this happened with Peter in Acts 10:25-26, He said get up... when John fell at the feet of the angel, Revelation 22:8-9 the angel said to John get up... worship God! But here Joshua falls at the feet of this *captain of the LORD's host*. This captain is Jesus.

There is a great Promised Land awaiting the children of Israel. The children of Israel have been told by God to go up fight conquer and win to obtain the Promise land. God is going to give it to them but He is not going to give it to them unless they fight! Back to Hebrews 2: 9-11 the Bible says *we see Jesus who was made a little lower than the angels for the suffering of death....* Here is the Son of God made manifest in a body of flesh; that body is prepared for dying, that Jesus who died, we see Him *crowned with glory and honour; that he by the grace of God should taste death for every man*. Jesus Christ the man is crowned by God with glory and honour. Verse 10. *For it became him, for whom are all things, and by whom are all things, in bringing many sons unto glory...* Jesus Christ is crowned with glory and honour. He is not crowed with heaven and honour – He is crowned with glory and honour. He is going to lead us to glory, not to heaven.

What does He want to do? He wants to bring those that are now sons of God into glory. He wants to bring us to the place of victory over the world, the flesh, the devil that Jesus Himself accomplished when He lived on this earth in a body of flesh. In Hebrews 2:10-11, *...to make the captain of their salvation perfect through sufferings. 11 For both he that sanctifieth and they who are sanctified are all of one: for which cause he is not ashamed to call them brethren....* God promised the children of Israel the land of Canaan. It is full of Canaanites, giants, walled cities and enemy armies. What do they have to do? They have to go up and fight. The captain of the host appeared saying if you will follow me you cannot lose. In Hebrews 2 We become a part of the captain of their salvation. God wants to give me a life of victory over my habits, victory over sin, victory over the world. The captain of the host steps on the scene of our lives saying follow me I will give you the victory. I am glad to be in Christ the captain of their salvation.

II. The Desire of All Nations

Haggai chapter 2:6-7 *For thus saith the LORD of hosts; Yet once, it is a little while, and I will shake the heavens, and the earth, and the sea, and the dry land; 7 And I will shake all nations, and the desire of all nations shall come: and I will fill this house with glory, saith the LORD....* Though not a proper name for Jesus, evidence of no capital letter, yet obviously it is Jesus Christ. Do you know what the people wanted? Peace, safety, prosperity all that comes from Jesus Christ, He is the desire of nations. The world and the people of this world want the attributes that come with Jesus Christ. The problem is they want sin also, and God says you cannot have peace, safety, and prosperity with sin. They want sin... they want to serve Satan. If you serve Satan you get Satan's rewards. If you serve God, you get God's rewards. In Haggai 2:7 He is the desire of all nations.

III. The Daysman

Job 9: 28-35. *I am afraid of all my sorrows, I know that thou wilt not hold me innocent.* (Did you ever get under conviction? Prior to your salvation you were under conviction for your sin. Then the day came where you realized that God would not hold you innocent, you are guilty.) *29 If I be wicked, why then labour I in vain?* (How many of us tried to quit sinning tried to reform, tried to turn over a new leaf but never could.) (How many of us have said to ourselves, "I am just wicked and there is nothing I can do about that.") *30 If I wash myself with snow water, and make my hands never so clean; 31 Yet shalt thou plunge me in the ditch, and mine own clothes shall abhor me.* (How can we be clean before God? I go to church, do all the things they tell me to do and by the end of the week, I am right back where I started.) *32. For he is not a man, as I am, that I should answer him, and we should come together in judgment. 33 Neither is there any daysman betwixt us, that might lay his hand upon us both. 34 Let him take his rod away from me, and let not his fear terrify me: 35 Then would I speak, and not fear him; but it is not so with me.* He said I cannot come to God. I am not innocent, wicked, dirty... when I try to get clean, then I compare myself to Him I find out I am still dirty. Therefore I am afraid of God. He is going to break me with His rod. If there was just somebody that could bring me to God – but there is not. Isn't that sad? That is Job sitting out there on the ash heap.

1 Samuel 2:25. *If one man sin against another, the judge shall judge him: but if a man sin against the LORD, who shall intreat for him? Notwithstanding they hearkened not unto the voice of their father, because the LORD would slay them.* Here you have a man against a man. The judge comes in between them and he settles the matter. Do you see what he said? If man sin against

the LORD, who can come between and solve that problem? Job said there is nobody. In 1 Samuel... Eli says there is nobody... there is no advocate, no mediator, no daysman.

- When God made a covenant with Adam, God and Adam were still at odds there was no advocate.
- When God made a covenant with Noah, even after the flood there was still no one to stand in the gap between God and Noah and his family.
- There is no mediator under the law. Even when God chose Abraham .

But one day... Along came Jesus.

1 Timothy 2:3-4. *For this is good and acceptable in the sight of God our Saviour; 4 Who will have all men to be saved, and to come unto the knowledge of the truth. 5 For there is one God, and one mediator between God and men, the man Christ Jesus; 6 Who gave himself a ransom for all, to be testified in due time.* What do we have now that Job did not have? A *mediator*... someone to go between God and man. What do we have now that was non-existent in Samuel's day? Someone who can be the judge, the arbitrator between God and man. Job calls him a daysman.

In the fullness of the time, God sent forth His Son made of a woman... made in the likeness of sinful flesh but without sin. For thirty-three and one half years He steadily but surely walked toward the day when He would die on a hill outside Jerusalem bearing the sins of the world. As He hung upon that cross, He reached out one hand to God the Father the other He reached out to the human race, Jesus our Daysman, then now and forever.
