Names & Titles of Jesus Lesson 20 – Jesus The Deliverer

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I. Jesus is The Deliverer to solve the world's political problems

Let us begin our study in Romans 11: 25-28. *For I would not, brethren, that ye should be ignorant of this mystery, lest ye should be wise in your own conceits; that blindness in part is happened to Israel, until the fulness of the Gentiles be come in.* All the Jewish people are not lost. But a vast majority are. Spiritual blindness has affected the nation. What is happening in the meantime, the Lord is saving millions of Gentiles they are becoming Christians along with a few Jews, together they all make up the body of Christ. Here is the future promise. Verse 26 *And so all Israel shall be saved:* (There is coming a day) *as it is written, There shall come out of Sion the Deliverer* (capital "D." It is a person.) *...the Deliverer and shall turn away ungodliness from Jacob: 27 For this is my covenant unto them, when I shall take away their sins. 28 As concerning the gospel, they are enemies for your sakes: but as touching the election, they are beloved for the fathers' sakes.*

God created man in His own image... male and female created He them. Man was fruitful he multiplied he replenished the earth. (Genesis 1:28) The human race after the fall of Adam went deeper into sin until the day came when every imagination of the hearts of men was only evil continually from his youth up. (Genesis 6:5) It repented God in His heart that He made man. He determined to drown them in a flood. (Genesis 6:7) He saved Noah and his family; they were the only ones to believe in God enough to get into the ark. (Genesis 7:13) They got off the ark, God said to Noah and his family... be fruitful multiply and replenish the earth. (Genesis 8:17) Soon the earth was populated once again but man once more failed dramatically. The Lord looked in on them in Babel they were building a tower whose top would reach to heaven. (Genesis 11:4) The Lord came down and confounded their language and scattered them to the ends of the earth. (Genesis 11:7-9) They all went in different directions in their groups of common language.

Genesis 12, God looked down upon all of those groups of people and He called out a man, Abram, God said I am going to make of you a people and through that people I am going to show forth my purposes. (Genesis 12:1-3) God said I am going to make known my covenants to bring forth my Messiah, the Saviour into the world. (Genesis 17) Abram had a son Ishmael then after God changed his name to Abraham (Genesis 17:5) he had a son Isaac (Genesis 21:3). God said the promise goes to Isaac. From Isaac came Jacob and Esau, God said the promise goes to Jacob. The descendants of Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob became God's chosen people called in Romans

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chapter 11, His elect. The elect nation of Israel rejected the Saviour of sinners, the Lord Jesus Christ. In Romans 11:28 says as touching the gospel they are enemies... Romans 9:4 as touching the promises they are elect. The idea that election and salvation are the same is not biblical. God has an elect people, the nation of Israel; to those people starting with Abraham He gave great promises... exceeding great and precious promises.

- ✓ He gave them the promise of a land... a territory extending from the river of Egypt unto the great river, the river Euphrates: He did not give that promise to any other people.
- ✓ He gave them the promise of covenant blessings of physical health... of prosperity... of safety from their enemies round about.
- ✓ All of those promises He gave to the nation of Israel conditioned upon their obeying the law that He gave them on Mount Sinai.
- ✓ The Children of Israel made a blood covenant with God that they would do, and be obedient to all that the LORD had commanded them. (Exodus 24:3-8)

From the day He gave that law to the present they have never kept it. Every hundred years or so one man or woman within the nation of Israel would obey God seeking to honour Him seeking to keep His law; that would be such a radical departure from their countrymen that God would write entire chapters and books in the Bible about the exploits of this one person who trusted God believing His word. But the nation as a whole never kept their promises to God. For their disobedience forty years they wandered in the wilderness. When they finally reached the land of promise, God said destroy all the peoples of the land because they are corrupt, they will corrupt you if you don't destroy them. The Children of Israel only destroyed a part then quit they let the rest of them live. As God said the end result was that they were corrupted by them.

The book of Judges... forty years in captivity for disobedience; they repent and come out... another thirty years of captivity of disobedience again, each time God delivers them out of their trouble as soon as they repent and come back to God. Finally, the ten northern tribes are carried away into Chaldea... completely gone. Two southern tribes go into captivity in Babylon hundreds of years past God has nothing to say to the nation of Israel until an announcement is made *unto you a child is born...unto you a son is given. Go out there... in the manger and see the deliverer.* The Deliverer is the one who according to Romans 11 is going to bring about the final fulfillment of all the promises God made to Abraham and his people... despite their rebellion... despite their unbelief... despite all their failures for centuries, God keeps His promises. Through His deliverer – the Lord Jesus Christ.

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Romans 11: 26-27. *And so all Israel shall be saved: as it is written, There shall come out of Zion the Deliverer and shall turn away ungodliness from Jacob: 27 For this is my covenant unto them, when I shall take away their sins.* The problem in the Middle East is the same problem in our living rooms. It is sin. It is not politics, oil, treaties, or governments. The problem in the Middle East is sin. If the children of Israel had not sinned against God... if they had not lived ungodly lives there would have been no warfare in that land from the day they finally conquered its borders under Joshua until this present day. God would have caused them to dwell safely in their land. All their captivities, all their dispersion, all of these thousands of years of suffering by the Jewish people and the Gentile people alike is because of sin. *The wages of sin is death.*

It is going to take a Deliverer with a capital "D" who can deliver them from their ungodliness from their sin. God promised one day the Deliverer would come (not out of Washington, Beijing, Rome or Mecca.) The Deliverer would come out of Zion. Until Jesus Christ the Deliverer comes headlines in the newspaper will all read the same – ungodliness, sin and death. People get discouraged when we talk like this they want peace from some other source. The Bible says the only one who will ever bring everlasting peace to the Middle East is The Lord Jesus Christ the Prince of Peace the Deliverer.

II. A Deliverer who paid for sin

Psalm 14:1-7 *The fool hath said in his heart, There is no God. They are corrupt, they have done abominable works, there is none that doeth good.2 The LORD looked down from heaven upon the children of men, to see if there were any that did understand, and seek God. (Here is his conclusion.) 3 They are all gone aside, they are all together become filthy: there is none that doeth good, no, not one.4 Have all the workers of iniquity no knowledge? who eat up my people as they eat bread, and call not upon the LORD.5 There were they in great fear: for God is in the generation of the righteous.6 Ye have shamed the counsel of the poor, because the LORD is his refuge.7 Oh that the salvation of Israel were come out of Zion! when the LORD bringeth back the captivity of his people, Jacob shall rejoice, and Israel shall be glad.* Now when you read those first six verses you come to the conclusion if that is what God sees when He looks at all men, then we are hopeless. The Bible goes on to say, not yet... verse 7, *Oh that the salvation of Israel were come out of Zion!...* Who is that? That is the Deliverer. When Jesus comes He will fix everything. No one is going to be able to fix this world except for Jesus. When Jesus returns He will set His feet on the Mount of Olives... ride into Jerusalem... they will crown Him with many crowns... He will sit on that throne as King of kings and Lord of lords...and when Israel finally sees Him they will repent, humble themselves, turn from their ungodliness, turn from their iniquity, then they will go forth into all the world

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teaching all what Jesus said told them to do from the beginning. From that point we will have a thousand years of peace on this earth. The devil raises his head at the end of the thousand years. The Lord throws him in a lake of fire. Makes a new heaven and a new earth wherein dwelleth righteousness. Only Jesus is going to solve the sin problem.

III. He delivers us from the fear of death

In the meantime, all those that are saved have been delivered from the fear of death by Jesus the Deliverer. Hebrews 2:14-15 *Forasmuch then as the children are partakers of flesh and blood, he also himself likewise took part of the same; that through death he might destroy him that had the power of death, that is, the devil; 15 And deliver them who through fear of death were all their lifetime subject to bondage.* Jesus the Deliverer does not deliver Israel from their political situation in the world; He can deliver those who trust Him as Saviour from their fear of death. There are only two ways you can be free from the fear of death:

- 1) Become a total fool... thinking there is no God, no heaven, no hell. Your lifetime philosophy will only carry you till you reach death's door, then the fear will come with no way to escape.
- 2) The other way is to know that Jesus Christ has given you ever lasting life... and to be absent from the body is to be present with the Lord... to depart and to be with Christ is far better than being here.

The knowledge that Jesus Christ has given you eternal life will deliver you from the fear of death. He is the Deliverer; how did Jesus do that? (Verse 14) By destroying the devil, when did He destroy the devil? When He died upon the cross... His payment... the payment that He made for sin allowed Him to break the devil's hold upon our hearts, upon our minds.

Jesus delivered us from the fear of death by the death that He died upon the cross at Calvary. He's the Deliverer. He's the Deliverer for Israel. He's the Deliverer for the individual. In both cases, He delivers by taking care of the SIN problem.

IV. He has delivered us and will deliver us

2 Corinthians 1:9-10 *But we had the sentence of death in ourselves, that we should not trust in ourselves, but in God which raiseth the dead:* (Now watch this.) Are you saved look at verse 10. *Who delivered us from so great a death....* The past fear of death added to the wages of sin, the condemnation, consummating with the wrath of God, everything that was in my past, the moment that Jesus cried it is finished... the moment I trusted Him as my

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Saviour, everything that was in my past, was delivered by the Lord Jesus Christ. Praise God! **Who delivered** (past tense) **us from so great a death....** When the Holy Spirit says "so" it is gigantic. **so great a death....**

- I wasn't just going to die; I was going to die condemned.
- I wasn't just going to die condemned; I was going to die condemned and wake up in hell.
- I was going to wake up in hell in conscious torment.
- I was going to be in hell until the white throne judgment then stand before God and be sentenced to eternity in a lake of fire.

so great a death.... How do you deliver somebody from **so great a death....?** For God so loved the world that He gave His only begotten Son. The so of God's love is greater than the so of death. Praise the Lord! And if you're saved you have been delivered from **so great a death. ...and (v.10) and doth** (that is the ongoing; present tense) The moment I trusted Him He delivered me, when the devil comes trying to reclaim my soul, sin comes trying to drag me back into condemnation, fear comes trying to wrestle me back into its grip, the one who delivered me keeps on delivering me. The deliverer with a capital "D" that is Jesus He is all I need for lifelong deliverance. Verse 10. **Who delivered us** (past tense) **from so great a death, and doth** (present tense) **deliver: in whom we trust that he will yet deliver us**; One day you or I will step through the doorways of death. Death will be looking me right in the eye saying, "I am here for you." The Deliverer will step on the scene one more time and say "**DEATH... BE GONE! YOU HAVE NO STING LEFT TO IMPART! YOU HAVE NO VICTORY LEFT TO IMPART! YOU ARE FINISHED... I DEFEATED YOU...**" Our deliverer will put out his arm and He will escort me through the valley of the shadow of death where I will fear no evil. The one who has always been delivering me will again deliver me in that hour. **1 Corinthians 15:55 O death, where is thy sting? O grave, where is thy victory? 56 The sting of death is sin; and the strength of sin is the law. 57 But thanks be to God, which giveth us the victory through our Lord Jesus Christ.**
